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KARMATAND, BENGABAD, GIRIDIH WORKSHOP REPORT EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION DATE:-14/12/2023 (THURSDAY)

Today date:- 14/12/2023 (Thursday), a one-day workshop on the topic **Effective Communication** was organized in the Language Laboratory under the chairmanship of Principal Dr. Ajit Kumar Singh. Its main purpose is that when communication is effective, all parties involved feel satisfied and accomplished. By delivering messages clearly, there is no room for misunderstandings or changes in messages, reducing the potential for conflict.

On this occasion, Principal Dr. Singh said that- when they communicate, speakers are expected to fulfill general and specific objectives. For most, there are two general purposes: to inform or to persuade. The line between informing and persuading is not absolute, and many speeches will do a little of both.

Mr. Binod Kr. Suman said that- there are three types of communication – verbal, non-verbal and visual. Verbal communication has the advantage of immediate response and is best when the stakes are great. Verbal communication is also influenced by non-verbal cues such as body language, facial expression, and tone of voice.

Mr. Pawan Kumar Suman while giving his views said that – Effective communication is the process of exchanging ideas, thoughts, opinions, knowledge and data so that the message is received and understood with clarity and purpose. When we communicate effectively, both the sender and the receiver feel satisfied.

Dr. Rajesh Ravidas said that- Once you successfully identify your audience and listen to their intentions, needs and desires, you can have something to communicate. To do this effectively, use the 5 C's of communication to ensure that your message is:- (1)Clear (2)Correct (3)Complete (4)Concise (5)Compassionate
